

Before re-release for an attempt on a certification exam with the state, candidates must provide evidence of remediation by completing an online preparation platform or scheduling a review session.

After completion of the TEA required remediation and achieving a successful score on the practice exam, approval for another attempt on the certification will occur and an email sent about registering for the exam through <u>Pearson</u>.

240 Tutoring: Please contact me if this is the remediation that is chosen. Candidates will receive an invitation to create an account at a reduced fee of \$20.00 (normally \$39.95 a month) a month fee via credit card. Candidates have the ability and are responsible for cancelling their monthly subscription from their profile tab when they are ready.

*TEA mandates a 30-day wait period between testing dates and remediation prior to another attempt. This begins from the date of the first attempt on the exam.

*Candidates needing to retest for two or more portions of the Core Subjects EC-6 exam will need to register for overall exam instead of a single section. This is a benefit for cost and the five-test attempt count.

*EC-6 Candidates that have not successfully completed all sections of the 291-Core Subjects EC-6 must do so before the final phase out date for the test on 12/31/2021. Those that do not will be required to start over with the new 391-Core Subjects EC-6 testing after this date. (TEA slide attached)

*EC-6 Candidates taking 291-Core Subjects must complete all requirements for initial certification by 12/31/2022. (TEA slide attached)
