Master of Education: PK-12 Educational Leadership

With a master's degree in PK-12 Educational Leadership, you'll be prepared to navigate the rapidly changing educational landscape and be an equity-centered leader in a variety of settings.

Ph.D. in Educational Studies

This 66-hour program prepares students who aim to work in district, university, or policy settings which require a blend of practical, leadership, and research/inquiry skills.

Ed.D. in PK-12 Educational Leadership

This 54-hour executive leadership program emphasizes leading for equity and excellence, engaging in critical thinking and analysis, and applying inquiry and ethical decision-making skills in the PK-12 school/district context. The cohort-based program is designed for completion in three years, and convenes one weekend per month, with abbreviated but intense summer sessions.
