Specializations

SCHOOL COUNSELING (36-hour program)

This option prepares students to work in elementary, middle and high schools providing direct services and program delivery in the areas of guidance, individual and group planning, counseling, responsive services and system support services.

STUDENT AFFAIRS (36-hour program)

This option prepares students to work in colleges and universities in the area of student affairs. Students gain necessary knowledge and skills to work with college student populations—counseling in individual and group settings, program planning and evaluation and working collaboratively in a college setting.

CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING (60-hour program)

This rigorous, strength-based program prepares students for licensure in the state of Texas and prepares students to work with children, youth, adults and families in a variety of settings and to provide the necessary foundational knowledge to successfully pass the National Counselor Exam required by the Texas State Board of Examiners of Professional Counselors.
