Are you prepared to add a short audio clip explaining your work that will be recorded upon approval of your poster by your faculty mentor and the RPF committee? (Why was this topic of interest? What did you find? Why is your study/project important? What did you learn from this process?)		
Have you anticipated questions that others may ask about your work and thought about how you will answer those questions?		
Have you proofread your poster for spelling and grammatical errors?		
Can someone viewing your poster in the online format read all fonts and graphics?		
Have you checked your poster to make sure all literature, graphics, and photographs are appropriately cited and used with correct permissions?		
Have you included an informative title on your poster?		
Have you included your full name, degree program, and your faculty mentor's full name on your poster?
